



A Day's Schedule at...

Kintock Erie

5 to 7:30 am: Breakfast is served on a daily basis.

If reentrants are employed or enrolled in school, employment/school passes will be pre-approved and placed into SecurManage each week. When reentrants sign out of the facility, they must request a lunch bag if they will be at work or school during lunch time. Reentrants will also have a dinner tray available if their work schedule runs past the end of dinner time.

If reentrants are working or enrolled in school, they are eligible for two, 4-hour social passes during the week and two, 8-hour social passes during your days off from work. These passes can be taken to a residence. Reentrants become eligible for a 48-hour furlough pass (which must be approved by parole agents), if they work or go to school for more than 32 hours per week and are 30 days misconduct free.

If reentrants are not yet employed, they are eligible to job search with the assistance of an employment counselor or business services representative. Reentrants are also eligible to sign out of the facility on approved passes to obtain identification, medical insurance, go on medical appointments, treatment passes, legal passes, religious and social passes. All passes must be pre-approved by the reentrant's case manager.

Facility counts are conducted seven times per day inside the facility. In-house cleaning is conducted at 9 am and 9 pm on a daily basis. Reentrants are required to keep their area's clean and clutter-free during their time in the facility.

Case managers, counselors and employment specialists are available in the facility Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 5 pm. Case managers also have a late day one time per week to meet with reentrants who are out of the facility on passes during these time frames. A computer lab is available for reentrants and available times are posted throughout the facility.

There is a yard area with a basketball court that can be used during scheduled recreation times. Reentrants are permitted to smoke cigarettes in the yard area only.

Parole violators attend classes with a counselor and computer lab instructor throughout the day. Their case manager is also available to meet with reentrants for one-on-one sessions and to assist them with phone calls.

A medical department with two LPN's, a nurse practitioner/medical assistant and a psychiatrist is available. They assist the parole violators with any medical issues that need attention.
