DISABLED VETERANS' REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTION

Any honorably discharged veteran who is a resident of the Commonwealth shall be exempt from the payment of all real estate taxes levied upon any building, including a maximum of five acres of land upon which it stands, provided that all eligibility criteria is met.



Eligibility:

- Veteran must be a resident of the Commonwealth.
- Honorable Discharge.
- Served during established war service dates as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Veteran must have a total or 100% permanent service connected disability rating by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Dwelling is owned solely by the veteran or as an estate in the entirety.
- Veteran must occupy the real estate as his/her principal dwelling.
- Veteran must prove financial need.
- Upon the death of a qualified veteran, tax exemption may pass on to the unmarried surviving spouse if financial need can be shown.

VETERANS' EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Provides temporary financial aid in an emergency to veterans and their beneficiaries who reside in Pennsylvania for the necessities of life (food, shelter, fuel, clothing and medical expenses).

Eligibility:

- Honorable Discharge.
- Served during established war service dates as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Must be a Pennsylvania resident.
- Must suffer an unexpected loss of income within 180 days of application through no fault of the individual.
- May not be on Public Assistance.
- Must have a financial need.

Upon the recent death of a veteran, their spouse or orphaned children are eligible provided the veteran would have qualified prior to his/her death.

Payments:

If eligible, a veteran or their beneficiary is entitled to a total of three checks during a 12-month period. Rates are paid according to the number of persons in a household and the county in which they reside.

BLIND VETERANS' PENSION

Provides for a pension of \$150 per month.

Eligibility:

- Served in the military honorably.
- Resident of PA upon entering the military.
- Suffered a service-related injury or incurred a disease which resulted in loss of vision:

Visual acuity with the best correcting lens is 3/60 or 10/200 or equivalent, or less normal vision in the better eye.

Includes circumstances where the widest diameter of the visual field of the better eye has contracted to an angular distance of not greater than 20°.

PARALYZED VETERANS' PENSION

Provides for a pension of \$150 per month.

Eligibility:

- Served in the military honorably.
- Resident of PA upon entering the military.
- Suffered a service connected injury or disease resulting in the loss or loss of use of two or more extremities.



EDUCATIONAL GRATUITY



Educational gratuities (up to \$500.00 per semester/term) are for children of honorably discharged veterans who have wartime service-connected disabilities or children of veterans who die or died in service during a period of war or armed conflict.

Eligibility:

• Died in service during a period of war or armed conflict.

\mathbf{OR}

- Served during established war service dates as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Rated as totally and permanently disabled by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Children must be between the ages of 16 and 23, living within the Commonwealth five years prior to application and must attend a school within the Commonwealth.
- Honorable Discharge.

PERSIAN GULF CONFLICT VETERANS' BENEFIT ACT

The program allows for compensation to be paid to eligible service members (current and former) as well as certain surviving relatives of deceased veterans who served in Desert Shield/Storm.

Eligibility:

- Served with the United States Armed Forces, a reserve component of the United States Armed Forces or the Pennsylvania National Guard.
- Served on active duty in the Persian Gulf Theater of Operations during the period from August 2, 1990 to August 31, 1991 and received the Southwest Asia Service Medal.
- Been a legal resident of Pennsylvania at the time of active service (Aug 2, 1990 Aug 31, 1991).

Deadline: The deadline for submitting applications for the Persian Gulf Conflict Veterans' Benefit Program is August 31, 2015.

STATE VETERANS' HOMES

Eligibility:

- Honorable Discharge.
- Served in the U.S. or PA Armed Forces.
- Resident at time of entry or current resident of Pennsylvania.
